1. idiom

- 2. She gained experience from her part-time job.

#### 6. take action

**Meaning:** To do something to make a change. **Examples:** 

- 1. You must take action if you want results.
- 2. It's time to stop thinking and take action.

#### 7. no matter

**Meaning:** Regardless of; not affected by something. **Examples:** 

- 1. Keep going, **no matter** what others say.
- 2. I'll support you, **no matter** the result.

#### 8. rejection

**Meaning:** Being refused or not accepted. **Examples:** 

- 1. **Rejection** is part of trying new things.
- 2. Don't fear **rejection**—just try again.
